- 3. Would it surprise you to learn that the original title of the book was *The Last Supper*? Why do you think the author originally named the book *The Last Supper*? What does this title mean to you? Why do you think she changed it?
- 4. Have you ever had a holiday dinner go awry?
- 5. What is the significance of food in the novel? Why do you think that food plays such a central role in Jewish life?
- 6. Sylvia's children all have biblical names. What do you think is the significance of the names Sarah and Rebecca, in terms of this story? Gideon?
- 7. Why do you think the author included the song "Chad Gadya" in the book after the close of the Seder? What does this song mean to you?
